

If Janice Warder can't stay out of trouble in Dallas County, why should we believe things would be any different in Cooke County?

While serving as a prosecutor in the Dallas County D.A.'s office, Janice Warder obtained a wrongful life sentence for a man named Clay Chabot using perjured testimony of the real rapist. She also illegally withheld other evidence from the defense. Meanwhile, murder charges against the real rapist were dropped to misdemeanor theft by Warder, and she testified in a federal hearing that her first affidavit regarding the matter was false. DNA evidence has recently shown that two capital murder cases will now have to be tried because of her conduct. Warder's star witness lied, but was then rewarded. Warder knew the witness had lied previously.

Warder will not even be in Cooke County for the last part of early voting because she has to attend a three-day hearing in the Dallas County courtroom of the Honorable Mike Snipes to answer for her actions.

At best, her handling of the case is going to cost Dallas County taxpayers a great deal, as they seek to place the real rapist on trial and may have to re-try his possible accomplice. But that's not the only time Warder cost taxpayers a small fortune. When she moved from the prosecutor's office to the bench, she soaked taxpayers again by running an inefficient court. In September of 2006, The Dallas Morning News said, "Warder's court has been among the most expensive in recent years, both in total costs and net cost per disposition."

Warder's misdeeds did not go unnoticed by her peers. In the 2006 Dallas County Bar Association Poll, only one judicial candidate or sitting judge out of 52 on the ballot received lower scores than Warder. Then she was rejected by the voters of Dallas in the 2006 election.

Now Warder wants to be Cooke County's District Attorney. With this track record, along with the fact that she has not prepared a case for trial in 16 years, and has never tried a single case in a Cooke County courtroom, why should we trust her with the safety of our families? We have a tough, successful, well-qualified D.A. who is making Cooke County a safer place.
